# 4.1 CLOSING DATE FOR ENTRIES

Monday 25.08.25 23:59

#### **4.2 ENTRY PROCEDURE**

**4.2.1** Any competitor wishing to take part in the Historic Acropolis Rally 2025 must use the official **FIA Online Registration Platform** for their entry procedure in order to be accepted.

All crews who wish to score points in the FIA EHRC championship must make their entries by using the standard entry form for their championship available in the FIA application at: https://registrations.fia.com/EHRC.

### 4.2.1.1 FIA EHRC 'Wildcard' Entries.

Any competitor wishing to run immediately after the FIA EHRC priority seeding in the rally can enter as an **FIA EHRC 'wildcard'** entry. The cost is €100 per event, accessed and paid via the FIA registration platform above.

FIA EHRC wildcard entries <u>are not eligible to score championship points</u> but will run within the FIA EHRC championship registered crews on Leg 1 (seeded on performance grounds) and will then be mixed in results classification order on subsequent Legs.

Wildcard entries must use and send the entry form available at <a href="https://registrations.fia.com/EHRC">https://registrations.fia.com/EHRC</a> duly completed before the closing date of entries.

# 4.2.1.2 Pre-2000 or 'Class P2' Entries.

All entries placed into 'Class P2' (Pre-2000) cars on the event must be registered as an FIA EHRC Wildcard registered entry\* (\*unless the driver is already fully registered within the FIA EHRC championship.).







**4.2.2** Any other crews (Non Priority Drivers with vehicles eligible for Category 1,2,3,4) who are not registered in the EHRC, must use and send the entry form available at <a href="https://registrations.fia.com/EHRC">https://registrations.fia.com/EHRC</a> duly completed before the closing date of entries.

NPD drivers will run together on all days of the competition, always following the main EHRC field.

Please note that the FIA registration platform requires a user ID and a password to access the entry system. Please do not wait until the last moment to make your entry in order not to miss the entry closing date!

Any crew from abroad wishing to collect points in the Greek Historic Championship must send an e-mail to <u>fia office@oma-epa.gr</u> stating their preference.

#### 4.2.3 Acceptance of Entry Form

The entry application will only be accepted if duly completed and accompanied by the bank transfer of the total amount of the entry fee to the Organiser's bank account.

#### 4.2.4 National/International License Equivalence

Competition Licences delivered by the Hellenic Motorsport Federation (OMAE) have the same value as an International Licences for the rally. <u>Note</u>: Drivers and Co-drivers wishing to <u>score points</u> in the EHRC must participate in the rally with International Competition Licences only.

#### 4.2.5 FIA EHRC Championship Restrictions

All competitors should note that any FIA EHRC Championship registration must be completed before the **1**<sup>st</sup> **July of the championship season** to **score championship points** in FIA EHRC.

#### 4.3 NUMBER OF COMPETITORS ACCEPTED AND CLASSES

**4.3.1** The maximum number of entries accepted will be 80. If more than 80 entries are received, the Organiser reserves the sole right to decide which entries among the EHRC non-registered drivers will be accepted. FIA EHRC registered crews always have priority for entries.

#### 4.3.2 Cars eligible to enter the event

Cars complying with FIA EHRC Sporting Regulations Art.12 are eligible, with an additional class for vehicles up to December 31<sup>st</sup> 2000 with a valid FIA HTP.

In 2025, competitors are permitted to enter the rally using cars from the period **1**<sup>st</sup> **January 1993 to 31**<sup>st</sup> **December 2000** in a single class, known as '*Pre-2000*' (or 'P2'). This class is <u>not</u> eligible for overall wins or championship points and is only eligible for a **single class award** on the event in their own classification, with a trophy awarded to the winners of the class.







Competitors may enter the P2 class if their application for an FIA Historic Technical Passport has reached the FIA but is not yet finalised. It is permitted to enter without the actual HTP document providing that the ASN managing the HTP application <u>has sent to the FIA for review prior to the event</u>.

#### 4.3.5 CHANGES TO FIA CATEGORY 4 ELIGIBILITY.

Competitors should note that from 2025, FIA Appendix K has revised vehicle eligibility dates for FIA Category 4, as defined in the FIA EHRC Sporting Regulations. Previously, Category 4 ended at 31<sup>st</sup> December 1990. From 1<sup>st</sup> January 2025 onwards, the end date for FIA Category 4 homologated vehicles is now 31<sup>st</sup> December 1992.

#### **4.4 ENTRY FEES**

The entry fees for the Competition are fixed at €950 per car.

#### 4.4.1 Entry packages

The entry fee includes:

insurance (art.5) — Road book — rally documents for the crew — rally plates — rally souvenirs — service plate — awards and teams passes. Cocktail at the Ceremonial Start and Finish.

### 4.6 REFUNDS

Entry fees will be refunded in full:

- a) to candidates whose entry has not been accepted.
- b) in the case of the rally not taking place.

The Organizers will refund up to 50% of the competition entry fee to those competitors who, for reasons of "force majeure", duly certified by their ASN, were unable to start the Rally.

#### **5. INSURANCE**

The organiser provides the following insurance: Insurance cover will come into effect from the start and will cease at the end of the Rally or at the moment of withdrawal or disqualification of the Competitor.

### 5.1.1

### THIRD PARTY LIABILITY INSURANCE

Third party liability insurance (Traffic insurance) is compulsory for all crews taking part in the rally. All competitors must have a valid traffic insurance policy and present it at the administrative checking including a valid Insurance Green Card for non-E.U. registered vehicles. Vehicles with Technical Passport and racing plate numbers issued by the Greek Motorsport Federation are exempt from the obligations of this article.

**5.1.2** Entry fee includes a premium for Third Party liability insurance towards third parties during participation in Historic Acropolis Rally 2025.







- **5.1.3** Indemnity provided under insurance is: 1.300.000,00€ per incident with total liability up to 6.700.000,00€. These indemnities are according to Greek Law.
- **5.1.4** Insurance policy is drawn up with Insurance Company:

- **5.1.5** Competitors must bear in mind that Third Party insurance policy, taken out by the Organizer, covers only damage caused to third parties. Any injury caused by competitors to themselves, injuries and damages caused by competitor to other competitor or damage to vehicles participating in the Rally are not covered by the Third-Party insurance policy.

The organization declines all responsibility in the event of theft or damage to equipment within the various structures of the organization.

- **5.1.6** Competitors are free to take out a convenient and individual personal accident insurance on their own, in addition to the aforementioned third-party liability insurance. In any case, all competitors must have Personal Accident insurance cover that includes a clause for repatriation expenses. See also Art.5.2 regarding Personal Accident Insurance provided by Organizer and included in Entry Fee.
- **5.1.7** Service vehicles, even those having special marks issued by the Organizer, will not be treated as official Rally participants. Therefore, they are not covered by the Rally Third Party insurance policy and are subject to the owner's exclusive liability. Greek Law obliges any vehicle driven in Greece to have its own Third-Party Liability insurance regardless any additional insurance provided by the Organizer.
- **5.1.8** Organizer shall not be liable for any damage or accident caused to the competitors and their vehicles during the whole event, in the case of catastrophe, riots, demonstrations, vandalism, pandemic, etc. The competitors and crew members must bear all consequences (e.g. damages, fines and penalties) of any such incident. The Organizers shall not be liable for any law infringement.
- **5.1.9** The Third-Party liability insurance cover will come into effect from the time of administrative checking and scrutineering opening time and will end upon the expiry of one of the following time limits, whichever is the later:
- -time limit for protests or appeals or the end of any hearing by the Stewards,
- -end of the administrative checking and final checks,
- -end of the prize giving ceremony.
- **5.1.10** Insurance Policy of Third-Party Liability and Personal Accident Insurance are not valid if a competition vehicle:
- a) is excluded permanently from the event.
- b) is involuntarily or voluntarily out of the official route of the race for more than one (1) kilometer distance.

For all the above cases the crew and competitor are liable for any accident may occur. In case of accident by their fault, any compensation must be covered by their own Insurance cover.

For cases a, b, the competitor may proceed by his own responsibility or address to Organizers in order transportation to be arranged until the Service Park. Organizer is not liable for any damages may occur during such transportation or recovery nor liable for any time penalties that may be implemented due to delay of transportation.







**5.1.11** In case of accident with bodily injuries or material damages, competitors and drivers exempt FIA, ASN, event Organizers, Members of Organization Committee, from any liability and waive any right to claim from them any compensation or to bring claim against them to Civil or Criminal courts of justice. **5.1.12** Third party liability insurance is in force under the assumption that in Road Sections (Liaisons) competitors must fully comply with Greek Traffic Law, i.e., speed limit signs, traffic lights, traffic signs, etc.

The event Entry Fee includes insurance for personal accident during the entire period of the rally, covering Organizers, Competitors, Timekeepers, members of Organizing Committee, any other person directly related with the rally.

#### 6. ADVERTISING & IDENTIFICATION

#### **6.1 Prohibited Tobacco Advertising**

For the avoidance of doubt, <u>all</u> tobacco advertising is <u>prohibited</u> from use on competition vehicles within FIA EHRC. Replica liveries from the period must be suitably modified to avoid using the full name of the tobacco company, where present. It is the competitor's personal responsibility to ensure the legality of their vehicle livery at all times in the country where the competition takes place.

#### **National Restrictions on Advertising**

Competitors are allowed to place any advertising on their cars with the following conditions:

- There shall be no advertising of tobacco or tobacco products prohibited by Greek legislation.
- It must not contravene the Laws of the State and the provisions of the NPA.
- Not to be offensive.
- Not to have religious or political content.
- Not to obstruct the visibility of the crew through the windows

Must comply with the article 2.1.9 of Appendix K.

#### 7. TYRES

#### 7.1 NUMBER OF TYRES & TYRE MARKING/REGISTRATION PROCEDURE

#### 7.1.1 Eligible tyres

Tyres must have a minimum external diameter corresponding to the period in question (see *Appendix XI, Tyres, FIA Appendix K 2025 Article 4.2*). Any alteration, modification or adaptation (which for the avoidance of doubt includes cutting of additional grooves) of tyres other than wear through normal use is forbidden. **The use of treadless or 'racing' slick tyres is prohibited for all cars**.

The make and model of tyres to use is free. For stages run on gravel, and so declared by the clerk of the course, no «E» or «DOT» tyre marking is necessary.

All tyres to be used should be fitted with an FIA approved barcode. Where this is not available, the competitor must liaise with the FIA Eligibility Delegate at the event to obtain FIA barcode stickers solely for the purpose of tyre registration and tyre use monitoring.

# 7.1.2 - Number of Tyres

During rallies classed as gravel, all competitors are limited to a maximum of 20 gravel tyres per event.

Any competitor found to be using tyres that are not registered for the event will be reported to the Stewards. The tyre limits specified apply to <u>all</u> competitors, classes and vehicle categories with no exceptions if the entry is placed through the FIA entry system.

#### 7.1.2.1 – Tyre Registration Procedure

Competitors must visit the FIA EHRC Official Sportity channel (password: **FIAEHRC**), and carefully read **Bulletin 3 – Tyre Registration**. This includes clear instruction on the tyre registration process, and includes a copy of the **mandatory** Tyre Registration form to be used by ALL competitors in the FIA section of the rally.

A reminder of the bulletin will be issued on the ONB prior to the start of the event.







#### 7.1.3 Means of control.

Checks for compliance with this regulation may be undertaken <u>at any time</u> during the rally and any discrepancies will be reported to the stewards. All tyres used on the car must be recorded on the tyre registration form, including any spare wheels/tyres in the vehicle.

#### 7.2 TYRES USED FOR RECONNAISSANCE

Only E- or DOT-approved homologated road legal tyres are allowed. Re-treaded tyres are forbidden for reconnaissance. Any treatment (ie. removing or damaging) on road tyres side markings or texts is not allowed.

### 7.3 NATIONAL LAWS OR SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

7.3.1 Any chemical and/or mechanical treatment of tyres is prohibited.

7.3.2 Speeding, where speed limits are marked in the route book within residential areas will incur a fine applied by the clerk of the course as follows - per km per hour over the speed limit: €25.

The fine will be doubled in case of a second offence committed during reconnaissance

#### 8. SERVICE AND FUEL

#### **8.1 SERVICE – GENERAL CONDITIONS**

All services made on the car for the duration of the rally must be made in accordance with the EHRC Sporting Regulations, Article 56.

#### 8.2 PERMITTED SERVICE LOCATIONS

#### 8.2.1 Service Park

The Service Park is situated at Itea's port parking area and will be open to the Competitors from Thursday -Sunday (04.09.2025 – 07.09.2025)

#### **8.2.2 Additional Service Zones**

Servicing will also be permitted in **Remote Service Zones** in accordance with EHRC Sporting Regulations Article 60, at the following locations:

- Leg 2 Section 4: Amfiklia 1 after the 10<sup>th</sup> SS of Leg 2. GPS coordinates: 38.63932, 22.59127

#### 8.2.3 Procedure in Remote Service Zones

Remote Service is also permitted outside the special stages in a predetermined area which will be marked in the road book. No other remote service locations are permitted, unless specified by the organizer by way of a bulletin or shown/marked in the road book.

#### **8.3 FUEL RESTRICTIONS**

It is mandatory for participants to use Fuel in accordance with FIA Appendix K Article 3.9.







#### 8.4 REFUELLING

8.4.1 All Competitors may only refuel in a Refuelling Zone (RZ) or Commercial Filling Station as indicated in the Road Book or authorised by the event organiser in a communication or bulletin.

Competitors cars may be refuelled from drums/cans within an official Refuelling Zone (RZ) or a Commercial Filling Station if permission is received from the Filling Station to do so. Two team members with team passes may access the official RZ or filling station to assist each crew. In order to access the refuelling zone, all team personnel must wear clothing that provides adequate protection against fire and includes at least: long trousers, long-sleeved top, closed shoes, a balaclava and gloves.

According to EHRC Sporting Regulations - Article 61.2.4 each competitor will be responsible to use environmental mats to protect the ground while the cars are refuelling.

Note: At each <u>official</u> organiser refuel zone, there will be environmental mats available from the organization, for use. Competitors wishing to refuel from fuel cans in a commercial filling station <u>must</u> use an environmental mat, supplied by the competitor/team.

#### 8.4.2 Refuelling in a Commercial Filling Station

When refuelling in a commercial filling station authorised to be used on the event, the competitors must exit the vehicle first. Should an **employee of the commercial filling station** offer to complete the refuelling process for the crew, this offer can be accepted providing **no other work is done to the vehicle** at this time.

Only the competing crew are then authorised to check the vehicle is safe to proceed with on completion of the fuelling. Where the crew has the permission of the commercial filling station to refuel from their own fuel cans, it is permitted for team members to assist in the process, following the FIA EHRC refuel regulations at all times. The use of cigarettes or vaping is not permitted at any time in refuel areas.

#### 8.4.3 Refuelling procedure

The complete refuelling procedure must always follow Article 61.2 of the FIA EHRC Sporting Regulations. Competitors must leave the vehicle completely before refuelling can commence at all times. No competitor can be inside the vehicle at any point in the refuel process under any circumstances.

For the avoidance of doubt – a refuel zone is for <u>competition vehicle refuel purposes only</u>. No other tasks can be completed on the vehicle during refuel by the crew, their team, or by any third party in any circumstances. Any contravention of this is to be classed as illegal outside assistance.

#### 9. RECONNAISSANCE

#### 9.1 PROCEDURE FOR REGISTRATION

Reconnaissance registration will take place as follows:

Date: Monday 01.09.25 - Tuesday 02.09.25 - Wednesday 03.09.25 (3 days)

Location: OMAE Head Office, 1 Olympionikou Spyrou Loui Avenue – Velodrome, P.C. 15123 – Maroussi, GREECE.

Reconnaissance material will be issued upon collection of the Road Book.

#### 9.1.1 Registration form

Not applicable







### 9.1.2 Checking of Reconnaissance cars

Reconnaissance cars must comply with Art.35.1 of FIA EHRC Sporting Regulations.

If, for any reason, a crew is forced to replace the reconnaissance car during the reconnaissance, the Secretariat (phone: 0030 210 6892000) must be informed about the details of the new reconnaissance car. Failure to follow this procedure will result in refusal to participate in the reconnaissance.

Checking for reconnaissance cars will take place in OAKA, 1 Olympionikou Spyrou Loui Avenue, - Velodrome, P.C. 15123 Maroussi, Greece.

#### 9.1.3 Reconnaissance identification

The crew will receive identification for their car (2 number stickers). The number stickers must be fixed to the top right of the front windscreen and rear right side window during reconnaissance at all the times. Each crew will be issued with a reconnaissance card valid for the passages through each Special Stage. The card will be given to Competitors after checking of the recce car. This card must be carried in the reconnaissance vehicle (accompanied by a personal ID document) and must be shown during reconnaissance to Organisers and police. Failure to hand in this card will result in refusal to participate in the reconnaissance. The organiser will provide a recce tracker and instructions for use at Administrative Checks.

Registration for reconnaissance will take place in OAKA, 1 Olympionikou Spyrou Loui Avenue – Velodrome, P.C. 15123 Maroussi, Greece.

#### 9.2 RALLY SAFETY TRACKING SYSTEM

Throughout the rally there will be a satellite tracking system (To be announced via Bulletin and Rally Guide) installed in the cars. For this reason, the competitors prepare their for a 12 Volt supply directly from the battery. It will be installed on the front panel of the car and the cable should have a surplus of 1 meter. Installation of the GPS tracking system will take place during the initial technical inspection (scrutineering) on Friday 05.09.25.

#### 9.2.1 Safety tracking deposit

Each competitor will have to deposit 100 euros as a guarantee which will be returned in full upon the return of the tracker.

#### 9.3 RECONNAISSANCE TIME SCHEDULE

The full Reconnaissance Time Schedule is provided in Appendix 2 of these regulations.

# 9.4 RECONNAISSANCE RULES

The crews are obliged to follow all reconnaissance rules specified in FIA EHRC Sporting Regulations and these Supplementary Regulations.

#### 9.4.1 Reconnaissance

Reconnaissance will be organised in compliance with art. 35 of FIA EHRC Sporting Regulations and only series production cars conforming to art. 35.1 of FIA EHRC Sporting Regulations must be used.

#### 9.4.2 Speed limit (Art. 34.2 of FIA EHRC Sporting Regulations)

The maximum speed set for the reconnaissance of the SS is 70 km/h, except for those areas in which there are speed limit signs or in built-up areas (40 km/h or 30 km/h) or other limitations **marked** in the Road Book.







#### 9.4.3 Direction

Each crew may drive the Special Stages only in the direction of the rally. The crews must always enter and leave the Special Stages through the start and stop controls.

#### 9.4.4 Restriction of reconnaissance

Any driver, or his co-driver, or any other team member who has entered or intends to enter the rally and who wishes to drive 3 months ahead the rally on any road which is or might be used as a Special Stage in that rally, may only do so after he has obtained written permission from clerk of the course. Failure to respect this rule shall result in the driver being reported to the stewards.

# 9.4.5 Number of persons on board

During each passage through a Special Stage, the competing crew only is permitted in the car.

#### 9.4.6 Number of passages

Number of passages of reconnaissance is free within the published time schedule for reconnaissance.

#### 9.4.7 Illegal reconnaissance

Illegal reconnaissance performed out of the official time schedule will be reported to the Stewards.

#### 9.4.8 Speeding

Speeding will be penalized according to the Art. 34.2 of FIA EHRC Sporting Regulations.

Speeding during reconnaissance will incur a fine applied by the clerk of the course as follows - per km per hour over the speed limit: €25.

The fine will be doubled in case of a second offence committed during reconnaissance.

### 9.4.9 Radar detection equipment

The fitting or carrying of radar detection equipment during reconnaissance is not permitted. Infringements will be reported to the stewards.

### 10. ADMINISTRATIVE CHECKS

### **10.1 DOCUMENTS TO BE PRESENTED**

At Administrative Checks, the following documents will be checked and entry form details verified:

- Competitor licence(s)
- Driver and Co-driver competition licences
- Driver and Co-driver valid driving licence
- ASN authorisation (mandatory for all foreign Competitors and/or Drivers)
- Completion of all details on the entry form
- Valid personal accident insurance of non-EU Drivers
- Competing car registration papers
- An in date, valid FIA Historic Technical Passport (HTP) document for the competing vehicle.

#### **10.2 TIMETABLE**

Administrative Checks will take place as follows:

All Administrative Checks **must be completed by 16:00** on Friday 05.09.25 at Rally HQ.







Drivers and Co-drivers must be present at Administrative Checks. **Only one visit is required to complete all mandatory Administrative Checks at each event.** 

# 11. SCRUTINEERING, SEALING AND MARKING

#### 11.1 SCRUTINEERING VENUE AND TIMETABLE

Venue: OAKA, 1 Olympionikou Spyrou Loui Avenue – Velodrome – Marousi, P.C. 15123 – GREECE

Date: Friday 05.09.25 08:00-16:00

Note: Scrutineering for FIA European Historic Rally Championship crews will be Friday 05.09.25 between 12:00-16:00 only.

The detailed timetable for pre-rally scrutineering will be published in a Bulletin before the rally.

Any crew taking part in the rally (or their representative) must arrive at the Scrutineering and present the car in accordance with the timetable to be issued in a Bulletin. Any lateness entering to pre-rally Scrutineering area will be sanctioned with a fine of €30 for each 10 minutes delayed unless agreed in advance with the organisers. Drivers and Co-drivers are not required to attend Scrutineering.

The car must be fully prepared and ready for all necessary sealing and marking (Art 16.1.2 FIA EHRC Sporting Regulations). Cars must be presented as follows:

- Compressor (turbocharger) (and spare) for all compressor equipped cars ready for sealing;
- The dismantled underbody protectors must be kept with the car for weight checks.
- Sealing wires must be installed according to the instructions given prior to scrutineering.

If the car is not prepared for the sealing as listed above, the car will not be authorised to access any further technical Scrutineering until it is ready. In the event that the car then blocks progress for other competitors or causes delays due to this non-compliance, the competitor may be reported to the Stewards by the Chief Scrutineer and a penalty or fine may be applied.

#### Documents to be presented at scrutineering:

- Vehicle registration document, where applicable.
- Authorisation from the owner of the car if he/she is not one of the Drivers.
- Valid vehicle insurance policy (e.g. Green Card).
- Vehicle original FIA HTP, with printed copy of homologation papers included.
- In addition, homologation form for roll cage (ROPS) (if homologated) must be with the car at Scrutineering.

#### 11.1.1 FIA HTP (Historic Technical Passport) Online Checker

Every crew must present their FIA HTP to the FIA Eligibility Delegate who will keep it until the end of the event. The HTP being presented must be in-date. **A National only HTP is not accepted**. All competitors should check prior to entering the rally the status of their FIA HTP document by visiting the official FIA HTP website at: <a href="https://htp.fia.com/">https://htp.fia.com/</a>

If your vehicle does not feature on this database, it is likely that you do not have a <u>valid</u> FIA HTP. Check with your ASN <u>immediately!</u> If the HTP is not provided at scrutineering, the car may not start the FIA







EHRC section of the rally and is **not eligible to score championship points**. The car may be moved into a separate section of the rally at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course and Stewards or be denied the opportunity to start the event.

#### 11.1.2 FIA Pre-Scrutineering HTP Compliance Check

The FIA Eligibility Delegate at the event may choose to select at random a sample of FIA EHRC or 'Wildcard' registered competitors' cars for a pre-event HTP compliance check immediately before or after technical scrutineering pre-event. This check will be to ensure compliance with the details provided in the HTP paperwork presented for the car. An official bulletin will inform competitors of the cars selected *prior* to the published start of scrutineering. If selected, it will be **mandatory** to attend. Competitors' cars who do not conform with their FIA HTP will form part of the FIA Eligibility Delegate report to the Stewards, who may impose a penalty or may request to the Clerk of the Course that the competitor is moved into another section of the rally due to HTP non-compliance.

### 11.2 CREW MEMBERS SAFETY EQUIPMENT

At Scrutineering, Competitors must produce **all** items of protective clothing, underwear, including helmets and a FIA approved head restraint (FHR formerly called HANS) intended to be used. **All fireproof underwear** <u>must</u> <u>have an FIA hologram</u>. Fireproof socks must be FIA 8856-2000 or FIA 8856-2018 certified – but a hologram may not be present on all socks. Compliance with Appendix L Chapter III will be checked. Any infringement may be penalised by the stewards. **Note:** *The use of FHR in Category 1 is* <u>highly recommended</u> but is not mandatory.

The use of crew members safety equipment may be checked at any time during the competition and must be worn correctly at all times between the start of the special stage and the STOP line.

### 11.6 AUXILIARY LIGHTING FOR THE COMPETITION VEHICLE

In the event of stage(s) running in darkness, competitors are authorised to use a maximum of **8** forward facing lights, including auxiliary lighting.

All Competitors in FIA EHRC Categories 1-4 must <u>not</u> use LED or High Intensity Gas Discharge (HiD) lighting systems, <u>as this is not period technology from the FIA Appendix K definition up to 1992</u>. This applies to all FIA Wildcard and NPD entrants in Categories 1-4.

Competitors in the 'P2 class' only are authorised to use lighting bulb technology available in the year of homologation the car is being presented to. The use of modern LED or 'Lazer' type auxiliary lighting is not permitted for ANY competition vehicle.

It is a mandatory requirement that competitors must present their competition vehicle in scrutineering with all auxiliary lighting attached, ready for technical inspection.

Any competitor found to be using non period lighting technology will be reported to the Stewards by the Chief Scrutineer.







#### 12. OTHER PROCEDURES

#### 12.1 CEREMONIAL START PROCEDURE

#### **Ceremonial Start procedure**

The official Ceremonial start will take place in Acropolis GPS Coordinates: 37.97020, 23.72245

#### 12.2 FINISH PROCEDURE

The finish podium ramp will be outside the European Cultural Center in Delphi. The ceremonial finish will take place in the European Cultural Center in Delphi, in the open air theater Frynihos. To be classified the Drivers must pass the last control TC 13A of the competition.

#### 12.3 PERMITTED EARLY CHECK-IN

Crews are authorised to check-in early without time penalty at the following time controls:

Itea Service IN – TC 7A. Service OUT/Parc Fermé in - TC 7B.

#### 12.4 START PROCEDURE AND START ORDER

#### 12.4.1 Starting order and Intervals

The start order will be according to Article 41 of the FIA EHRC Sporting Regulations. *The starting procedure is*:

Leg 1 Starting Order	<ul> <li>FIA EHRC and FIA Wildcard Crews Categories 1-4 in seeded order.</li> <li>NPD entered drivers in seeded order.</li> <li>Pre-2000 (P2) Class Entries in seeded order.</li> </ul>
Starting Order, Leg 2 Onwards	<ul> <li>FIA EHRC and FIA Wildcard Crews (Cat1-4) in Classification Order.</li> <li>NPD entered drivers in Classification Order.</li> <li>Pre-2000 (P2) Class in Classification Order.</li> </ul>

The starting interval between each car will be two minutes. For SS7, the organiser will review during the event the possibility to increase the starting time gaps on safety grounds due to the stage running at night, if required.

# 12.4.1.2 Mandatory Time Gaps Between Fields

A mandatory **safety time gap** will be inserted between the last car in the main **FIA EHRC/NPD fields** and the **first Pre-2000/P2** cars for safety reasons. The Clerk of the Course may decrease or increase the time gap at any time in the event in case of performance differences on safety grounds.

A suitable time gap may also be imposed between the last car in the main FIA EHRC field and the first car in the NPD field on <u>all</u> legs, depending on performance differences.







### 12.4.2 Start procedure for Special Stages

Start Procedure for Special Stages will be as follows:

on the left side of the timing panel there are three round lights.

1st red light: 10 seconds to start. 1st yellow light: 5 seconds to start. 2nd yellow light: 4 seconds to start. 3rd yellow light: 3 seconds to start. 4th yellow light: 2 seconds to start. 5th yellow light: 1 second to start.

1st green light: 0 START and remain green for 20 seconds.

At 10 seconds and each of the last 5 seconds the horn sounds at a low volume, while at 0 it sounds at an intense volume.

### 12.4.3 Re-start after retirement / Catch-up

Re-start will be allowed under all provisions applied in Article 54 of FIA EHRC Sporting Regulations. Any crew which has failed to complete Leg 1 can re-start the rally from the start of Leg 2 unless if they confirm otherwise to the Clerk of the Course prior to the publication of the start list of Leg 2, Saturday September 6th at 22:30. The restarting car must report to the overnight Parc Fermé prior to Leg 2, on Sunday 07.09.25 at 07:30. The re-scrutineering will take place in Parc Fermé no later than 30 minutes before the first car starts the next leg. A team member is authorised to place the vehicle into the Parc Fermé area for re-scrutineering.

#### 12.5 REMOVAL OF CARS FROM THE FINAL PARC FERMÉ

Cars may be removed from final Parc Fermé once the stewards authorise its opening, or the time for protests to be received after the publication of the final results has expired. Provided that the above takes place as scheduled, all cars must be removed no later than 22:00 on Sunday, September 7<sup>th</sup>, 2025.

# 12.6 OFFICIAL TIME USED DURING THE RALLY

Throughout the rally, the official time will be taken from the <u>www.time.is</u> website. A link to the official event time will be provided on the DNB.

#### 12.7 TIMECARDS

**12.7.1.** New timecards will be issued to the Competitors at the following time controls: **TC 0, TC 3B, TC6B, TC 7C, TC 10B.** 

**12.7.2.** Upon retiring, a crew must hand in its timecard either to a marshal at a time Control or to the sweeping car. The crews must submit the timecard to the marshals at the end of each section completed. The crews are solely responsible for the proper management of their time log, starting with administrative checks.

#### 12.8 OPTIONAL SHAKEDOWN

An optional Shakedown will be organised on **Thursday, September 4th 2025 (Thiva hospital / 4.08 km)**. It will take place from 16:00 to 19:00. Shakedown is only for competitors who will request it on their entry form and who have paid the €200 fee.

If less than 10 cars are registered for the shakedown at the closing date of Rally Entries, Monday, August 25th 2025, shakedown will be cancelled and no alternative offered by the organiser.







The crews will receive the sticker and the timecard for the Shakedown at the start of shakedown stage. Drivers and co-drivers <u>must</u> wear their full FIA compliant racing outfits including FHR, where required in the regulations of FIA EHRC. 4 passages of the stage are allowed as a maximum to all crews.

Note: Tyres used in shakedown do not need to be registered on the official Tyre Registration form.

# 14. PRIZES

#### 14.1 PRIZE-GIVING

Date: Sunday 07.09.25 18:30

Location: European Cultural Delphi Center – open air Theatre "FRYNIHOS"

Prizes will be awarded according to the final results of the FIA EHRC registered classification, and then the final results of the overall rally for NPD and class P2 drivers.

The following trophies will be awarded <u>as a minimum</u> (to both Driver and Co-driver) of FIA EHRC <u>registered</u> crews:

- Top 3 classified in the FIA EHRC <u>overall</u> classification for EHRC registered competitors only in Categories 1-4.
- EHRC Championship Registered Winners in each category (1, 2, 3, 4).
- EHRC Championship Registered Winners in each class, as defined in these regulations.
- EHRC Championship Registered Winners in FIA EHRC 1600 cc Trophy.
- EHRC Championship Registered Winners in FIA EHRC FWD Trophy.
- 1st place in the Pre-2000/P2 Class.
- Where there are three or more entered or classified in any category or class, awards for 2nd place will be given.
- Where there are <u>six</u> or more entered or classified in any category or class, awards for 3rd place will be given.

The national anthem of the winning driver registered in FIA EHRC will be played at the finish ceremony for the Top 3 registered crews overall in FIA EHRC, with a champagne spraying ceremony included.







The top 3 drivers registered in FIA EHRC must complete the podium in reverse order, so 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and then the 1<sup>st</sup> place in FIA EHRC. All remaining cars are to proceed in order of position at the final time control to the finish ramp to avoid delays.

FIA EHRC Awards for each competing car will be provided on the basis of the **FIA EHRC classification only**.

The prize giving for the EHRC section of the rally must respect <u>only</u> the classification of EHRC registered drivers and <u>does not include NPD drivers</u> in terms of allocating trophy awards for classes or categories within the FIA EHRC prize giving ceremony. NPD driver awards will be provided separately by the event. The following trophies will be awarded <u>as a minimum</u> (to both Driver and Co-driver) of NPD <u>registered</u> crews:

- Top 3 classified in the <u>overall</u> classification for National Championship registered competitors only in Categories 1-4.
- National Championship Registered Winners in each category (1, 2, 3, 4).
- National Championship Registered Winners in each class, as defined in these regulations.
- National Championship Registered Winners in 1600 cc Trophy.
- National Championship Registered Winners in FWD Trophy.
- Top 3 winners in category 5.
- Where there are three entered or classified in any category or class, awards for 1st place will be given.
- Where there are five or more entered or classified in any category or class, awards for 3rd place will be given.

The prizes will be awarded to the winners at a small finish line celebration at the Frynichos Theatre at the Delphi European Centre immediately after the finish ramp. Prize giving ceremony for EHRC Drivers and then for NPD drivers.

#### 15. FINAL CHECKS AND PROTESTS

#### 15.1 Final Scrutineering

Date: Sunday 07.09.25 17:30

Location: Delfi Parc Fermé – parking area

FIA EHRC Competitors who will be selected for final Scrutineering are requested to provide proper equipment (including all sealed spare parts) and mechanics at the Final Scrutineering venue.

Each selected car will be driven to Final Scrutineering by a designated member of the team (who must be present at the finish) and accompanied by an official. In case of a protest, the said car will be checked at BANDELAS NAPOLEON SERVICE at National Road Amfissas – Galaxidi, Itea.

#### 15.2 PROTEST DEPOSIT

The protest deposit is €1,000.00 (FIA EHRC Sporting Regulations - Art. 65.2).

In the case of protests referring to the alleged non-compliance of Automobiles with the regulations and requiring the dismantling and re-assembly of clearly defined parts of an Automobile, an additional deposit may be specified by the stewards on a proposal from the FIA Eligibility Delegate.







This additional deposit must be paid by the protester within one hour upon notification of the stewards (or, where appropriate, within such timeframe as agreed by them) otherwise, the protest will be deemed inadmissible.

# **15.3 APPEAL DEPOSIT**

The appeal deposit for an international appeal is: €3,000.00

All protests and/or appeals must be lodged in accordance with Articles 13 and 15 of the Code and, where applicable, with the FIA Judicial and Disciplinary Rules.



**3 – rear/side windows:** Two numbers for each rear side window, 20cm high and at least 2,5cm thick, in fluorescent yellow (PMS 803), on a transparent background, which may be reflective.

- Optional Advertising space reserved for Organiser's advertising Included in door panels
- Driver and Co-Driver Names

The names of the crew plus their national flags must appear on both sides of the wings at the front of the car (max size  $10 \text{cm} \times 40 \text{cm}$ ). Any car failing to comply with this rule shall be subject to a penalty.

# APPENDIX 5. EXTRACTS FROM FIA APPENDIX L RELATING TO OVERALLS, HELMETS AND ANY OTHER SAFETY REQUIREMENTS

All competitors are reminded of Appendix L of the FIA International Sporting Code, in particular its Chapter III - Drivers' Equipment. Many crash helmets have expired for International rally use!

#### Helmets (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 1)

All crews must wear crash helmets homologated to one of the following FIA standards:

- 8859-2015 & SNELL 2015 or/SNELL 2020 (Technical List N°49) No current expiry date.
- 8860-2010 (or 8860-2010 & SNELL SA 2010) (Technical List N°33) (Not valid after 2028)
- 8860-2018 or 8860-2018-ABP (Technical List N°69) No current expiry date.

#### Frontal Head Restraint (FHR, Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 3)

All crews must use FIA approved FHR systems homologated to FIA standard 8858. Approved FHRs, anchorages and tethers are listed in Technical List N° 29. See also helmet compatibility chart in Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 3.3.

# Flame-resistant clothing (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 2)

All drivers and co-drivers must wear overalls as well as gloves (optional for co-drivers), long underwear, a balaclava, socks and shoes homologated to the FIA 8856-2000 standard with an FIA hologram present on all items\*, (Technical List N°27) or 8856-2018 (Technical List N° 74). Please pay special attention to the prescriptions of Art. 2 concerning embroidery and printing on flame-resistant clothing (manufacturer certificates etc.) as well as concerning the correct wearing of the clothing elements! See also Regional Rally Sporting Regulations, Article 53.1.

\*Not all fireproof socks have an FIA hologram offered by the manufacturer. Socks with FIA 8856-2000 or FIA 8856-2018 will be accepted <u>without a hologram</u>, subject to checking by a scrutineer. **All other items** <u>must have an FIA hologram present or they will not be accepted at scrutineering.</u>

#### Biometric Devices (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 2.1)

Drivers may choose to wear a device to collect biometric data during racing:

- If the biometric device is integrated into a protective garment homologated to FIA Standard 8856, the garment shall be homologated to FIA Standards 8856 and 8868-2018.
- If the biometric device is a stand-alone device, then the device must be homologated to FIA Standard 8868-2018 only. This device must be worn in addition to the garment homologated to FIA Standard 8856.

#### Wearing of jewellery (Appendix L, Chapter III, Art. 5)

The wearing of jewellery in the form of body piercing, metal watches (apart for co-driver use) or metal neck chains is prohibited during the competition and may therefore be checked before the start, or at any location on the rally.

# APPENDIX 6. FIRE EXTINGUISHER EXEMPTION, FIA APPENDIX J.

In 2024, FIA Appendix J was updated, including **Article 253/7.3.1**, relating to handheld fire extinguishers.

#### Appendix J - Art. 253, Article 7.3.1

#### FIA Championships as from 01.01.2024 / Rally Cars:

All cars must be fitted with <u>two fire extinguishers</u> in compliance with Articles 7.3.2 to 7.3.5 hereunder or with FIA Standard 8865-2015 (Articles 7.3.2 to 7.3.5 hereunder do not apply in the latter case).

**Installation of the** <u>second manual extinguisher</u>: in accordance with Article 7.3.6 below. It can be installed in the cockpit or the luggage compartment.

As from 01.01.2024, at least one of the <u>two compulsory manual extinguishers</u> must be High Voltage compatible (see Article 253-18.23).

FIA Appendix K (Article 5.7.1) refers directly to Article 7.3.1 of Appendix J - Art. 253 for requirements on fire extinguishers.

#### **Exemption from FIA Historic Department**

The above requirement for *two handheld fire extinguishers* **DOES NOT APPLY** to *FIA European Historic Rally Championship* events in 2025, for all competitors using historic competition vehicles in compliance with Appendix K, with a valid FIA HTP.

Only <u>one handheld fire extinguisher</u> in the vehicle is mandatory in 2025, alongside the FIA approved automatic fire system.

All fire extinguishers must be in-date and serviced correctly, in line with FIA regulations.

Where a competitor wishes to install a 2<sup>nd</sup> handheld fire extinguisher in their vehicle, this is encouraged where practical to do so on safety grounds.
